TWO IMPORTANT "SEVENTH" EVENTS

NCCU is gearing up for two significant milestones.

The Society's Seventh (7th) Annual General Meeting is scheduled to be held at the Goodwill Parish Hall on June 11, 2017.

According to NCCU's CEO, Aylmer Irish, NCCU performed well in 2016, and when the audited financial statements are presented to the AGM, members will be pleased with the credit union's performance and the surplus realised.

Before the AGM is held, the South Eastern Cooperative Credit Union is expected to transfer its assets and liabilities to NCCU.

South Eastern will then cease

to exist, and it will become the seventh branch of the NCCU with offices in La Plaine, Delices and Grand Fond.

With a Branch in the South East, NCCU's reach will be expanded allowing it to provide modern and affordable financial services to credit union members and residents of the area.

With a foothold in the South East, NCCU will have island-wide service coverage with 12 offices and eight ATMS to serve its 44,000 members.

Both are milestone "seventh" events that will highlight the size, growth and reach of the NCCU and provide positive publicity for the Society.

NCCU HELPS JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT HOST A BUSINESS TOWN






The St. David's Branch Wellness Committee was established in January 2017 as a method of reaching out and caring for members in the community.

It is important to keep the Certificate of Title (COT) for your home at NCCU as this is where you will take other loans for

meeting your various needs and wants -- education, vehicle, domestic, medical, travel, repairs, personal expenses, etc. Your COT will be needed to secure these loans.

It may be difficult to get smaller loans, when you need them, from the financial institution that is trying to persuade you to switch your mortgage from NCCU.

Think ahead. Keep your COT at NCCU so you won't have to scramble to find a co-maker or fall victim to a quick money fix.

Also, ensure your cheques are compliant. The number on the bottom left of your cheques must be 51000-0-20. If it is not, bring in your cheque book urgently to the Member Services Section, Roseau Branch.

Queen Jade shares

Worldwide, and especially within the Caribbean region, the discussion on Mental Illness/Health is one we continue to struggle with. It remains shrouded in secrecy and shame.

According to the World Health Organisation (WHO) one in four people will be affected by mental or neurological disorders at some point in their lives. Around 450 million people currently suffer from such conditions, placing mental disorders among the leading causes of ill-health and disability worldwide.

Treatments are available, but nearly two-thirds of people with a known mental disorder never seek help from a health professional. Stigma, discrimination and neglect prevent care and treatment from reaching people with mental disorders. Where there is neglect, there is little or no understanding and no understanding where there is neglect.

Many people have applauded me for my bravery and for being so supportive of my mother who suffers from mental illness. In my younger years, I struggled with this. I loved her, I just did not understand. Additionally education and awareness regarding mental illness were basically nonexistent.

As my bond with my mother grew, I resolved to be as supportive as possible and began to educate myself about this disorder.

More importantly, I decided to love unreservedly and appreciate the woman who loved me unconditionally, taught me the value of education, provided for me as best as she could, taught me to be respectful and kind, and beseeched me to do my best.

When the idea came to participate in the Miss Dominica 2017 pageant, I knew instantly the cause that I wanted to fight for and to hopefully make a lasting change in the way we view mental health/illness in Dominica. Thankfully, I won.

I invite you to assist me in my quest to break the stigma and foster a more supportive society for the mentally ill. Let us look beyond the disorder to see the individual and to offer support.

Education is key and so is early intervention. We must seek help for ourselves and others when we see the warning signs.

Let us all work together towards eradicating the fear associated with this disorder and towards a mentally healthy and supportive society.
