cheque stop: When you have written a cheque, take a few seconds to confirm it is filled out completely and accurately. Ensure it is dated (remember it is now 2017), words and figures agree, the payee's name (recipient) is included, the numerical amount is included next to EC\$____ and that you have signed. Check your account balance before writing cheques.

WALK WITH ID: A valid picture identification is necessary for transacting business at NCCU. Ensure you walk with ID--Social Security Card, driver's licence, passport or school ID.

mental health


